Who This Program is For

Through this pilot program, the Oriol Foundation is offering funding to help local groups make public events more accessible for people living with neurological conditions such as:

- Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
- ADHD
- Epilepsy
- Tourette Syndrome
- Sensory Processing Disorders
- Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)
- Alzheimer's Disease and other forms of dementia
- Parkinson's Disease
- Multiple Sclerosis (MS)
- ALS (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis)

Accessibility Matters. Let's Make It Happen.

The Oriol Foundation created the Accessibility Grant for Neurological Inclusion — to help local groups create more welcoming, inclusive experiences for people living with neurological conditions. If you're planning a public event in 2026, this grant can help you take meaningful steps to support participation for all.

Grant Overview & Details

Eligible applicants may request up to \$1,000 in funding to offset costs related to neurological accessibility at public events.

Funding may be used for (but is not limited to):

- Sensory-friendly tools and resources
- Communication supports (AAC devices, visual aids)
- Cognitive rest areas or quiet rooms
- Staff training in neurodiversity and dementia awareness
- Mobility assistance or accessible layouts
- Outreach to neurodivergent and caregiving communities

Eligibility

Applicants must be a nonprofit, community group, school, municipal department, or other public-serving entity located in — or actively serving — Holden, Paxton, Princeton, Rutland, Sterling, Boylston, or West Boylston, MA.

The proposed project must:

- Support a public event in 2026
- Demonstrate clear accessibility enhancements for people with neurological conditions
- Be open and accessible to the general public
