#### Building on Our First Year

In 2026, the Oriol Foundation awarded its first Accessibility Grant for Neurological Inclusion to **Mountview Middle School in Holden**.

Grant funding supported sensory resources for the school's **Therapeutic Learning Center**, helping students manage overstimulation and anxiety, improve focus, and more fully participate with their peers.

#### Who This Program Is For

The grant supports accessibility for people living with neurological conditions, including:

**Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) • ADHD • Epilepsy • Tourette Syndrome • Sensory Processing Disorders • Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) • Alzheimer's Disease and other forms of dementia • Parkinson's Disease • Multiple Sclerosis (MS) • ALS**

Funding may support **sensory-friendly environments, cognitive rest areas, communication resources, outreach, staff training, and other creative accessibility solutions.**
